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| <b>Research Title</b>       | Desired Characteristics of Law Students for Field Experience Internship |
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This research, “the Desired Characteristics of Law Students for Field Experience Internship”, has two objectives. First is to study the desired characteristic of law students for Field Experience Internship from the perspective of the organizations who provides the internship and the interned student themselves. Secondly it aims to compare the desired characteristics found from the two sample groups using the mixed-method, consisting of both qualitative and quantitative methods. A mixed-method is used in this research to the two sample group. The first is the group of 75 undergraduates attending Law Program of the Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences, Suan Dusit University and the second is the group of 75 representatives of the organizations, both governmental and private, who provide internship program to the students. These samplers are requested to fill 150 questionnaires in line with means of purposive sampling. In addition, ten representatives of the organization were purposively interviewed. The questionnaire and the interview script are developed by researchers. Data analysis includes descriptive and reference statistics.

Two major findings are as follows:

1. The desired characteristics of law students for field experience internship from the perspective of the interned student and the interning organization representatives overall are at the highest level.
2. The resulting desired characteristics of law students for field experience internship in law found from both groups of students and representative of organization that students interned at are largely similar. Ethics, morality, legal professional ethics, fundamental working skills and legal knowledge are perceived equally important for the field experience internship.
